Areas of Intervention

Direct humanitarian assistance



- distribution of non-food items, food and water to vulnerable
- medical, psychological and livelihood support for migrants in need
- assistance to the voluntary return and reintegration of migrants to their countries of origin
- enhance of reception conditions in the N'Djamena airport and in two medical clinics in Faya and Moussoro

Capacity building



- development of a training guide on national legislative and institutional Chadian frameworks on services provision to migrants and on identification, referral and protection of vulnerable migrants
- **specialised trainings** for security and law enforcement officers and Chadian authorities based on the guide on human rights and protection principles

Duration and budget of the project

Main results achieved in phase 4 until January 2021

vulnerable migrants received emergency assistance including food, water, shelter and critical non-food items.

migrants received psychosocial counselling support and medical assistance.

third-country nationals have been assisted to return to their country of origin.

migrants have been reached through awareness sessions to be informed of the assistance available.

Areas of Intervention

Child Protection



- psychosocial support and recreational activities for migrant children
- assistance to young migrants through vocational trainings and capacity building activities on entrepreneurship

Capacity building



- training for social assistants, operators and judges in the field of child protection, family tracing and family reunification
- training for law enforcement officers on migrants' protection

Awareness raising



- awareness raising for leaders of local communities on the protection of migrant children
- awareness raising for children, parents, youngsters and for communities on the risks related to unsafe child migration
- awareness raising for teachers on the protection of migrant children and on the prevention of risks related to unsafe child migration
