



Direct assistance



- distribution of non-food items to migrants in need
- medical and psychological assistance to migrants at disembarkation points (DPs) and detention centres (DCs)
- organization of anti-scabies campaigns
- enhancement of DPs and DCs through rehabilitation and renovation works

Capacity building



- Delivery of trainings on first aid operations at sea, development of Standard Operating Procedures and screening of migrants addressing members of the Libyan Coast Guard, Libyan Directorate for Combating Illegal Migration and Libyan Red Crescent
- assistance to Libyan authorities through the provision of an electronic registration system for the registration and initial screening of migrants

- provide basic health services to migrant mothers and their children through the access to primary health facilities and the provision of medicines and/or medical treatments
- enhance housing standards through supply of basic housing items and minor WASH interventions

Areas of Intervention

Direct assistance



- medical consultations, distribution of winter and domestic lifesaving kits at disembarkation points and detention centres
- advocacy activities to release asylum-seekers and refugees held in detention centres
- Monitoring at Detention Centers for the identification of asylumseekers and refugees
- Pre-departure assistance in the framework of resettlement and alternative legal pathways

Capacity building



- delivery of trainings on international protection law and principles for National Officials
- development of Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs) and screening of refugees and asylum-seekers rescued at sea at disembarkation points and detention centres

Durable Solutions



 enhance access to durable solutions through the strengthening of the resettlement programme and/or other legal channels of admission in safe countries
