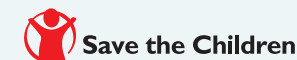

- ♦ **delivery of psychological first-aid (PFA) training courses** for stakeholders working with migrant and refugee children in support field staff to enhance the capacities and expertise to reduce children's distress after a traumatic event

Areas of Intervention

Direct assistance



- ◆ **distribution of non-food items** to migrants in need
- ◆ **medical and psychological assistance** to migrants at disembarkation points (DPs) and detention centres (DCs)
- ◆ organization of **anti-scabies campaigns**
- ◆ **enhancement of DPs and DCs** through rehabilitation and renovation works

Capacity building



- ◆ **Delivery of trainings on first aid operations at sea, development of Standard Operating Procedures and screening of migrants** addressing members of the Libyan Coast Guard, Libyan Directorate for Combating Illegal Migration and Libyan Red Crescent
- ◆ **assistance to Libyan authorities** through the provision of an electronic registration system for the registration and initial screening of migrants

Main results achieved in phase 1 until December 2019

- 3** specialized trainings organized
 - 3** meetings of the Technical Working Group – Contact Group held
 - 3** disembarkation points enhanced with adequate facilities
 - 9** reception facilities enhanced at DCIM retention centres
 - 3** trainings on First Aid organized
- 6,000** migrants disembarked at the targeted points received direct assistance
- 5** meetings of the inter-agency Contact Group organized
- 333** Libyan officials have been trained on different topics
- 1** registration system for initial screening and registration of migrants created

Main results achieved in phase 3 and 4 until December 2020

- 5** registration workstations installed at targeted disembarkation points and detention centres
 - 202** DCIM, General Administration of Coast Security (GACS) and Libyan authorities were trained through 14 training sessions
 - 3** prefabricated registration units delivered in 3 detention centers
- 54** Libyan officials from LCG, GACS and DCIM received registration training on Migration Data Management and Registration System for Data Entry Staff in 3 sessions
- 57** Libyan officials from LCG, GACS and DCIM received Migration Data Management and Standard Operating Procedures training in 3 sessions

Areas of Intervention

Direct assistance



- ◆ **ensure migrant's access to life-saving assistance** through the provision of basic goods such as food and non-food items
- ◆ **provide basic health services** to migrant mothers and their children through the access to primary health facilities and the provision of medicines and/or medical treatments
- ◆ **enhance housing standards** through supply of basic housing items and minor WASH interventions

Areas of Intervention

Direct assistance



- ◆ **medical consultations**, distribution of winter and domestic life-saving kits at disembarkation points and detention centres
- ◆ **advocacy activities** to release asylum-seekers and refugees held in detention centres
- ◆ Monitoring at Detention Centers for the **identification of asylum-seekers and refugees**
- ◆ **Pre-departure assistance** in the framework of resettlement and alternative legal pathways

Capacity building



- ◆ delivery of **trainings on international protection law** and principles for National Officials
- ◆ **development of Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs)** and screening of refugees and asylum-seekers rescued at sea at disembarkation points and detention centres

Durable Solutions



- ◆ enhance access to durable solutions through the **strengthening of the resettlement programme** and/or other legal channels of admission in safe countries
