Areas of Intervention

Protection of migrants and child protection



- 1. Prevent abuse or exploitation of unaccompanied migrant children in the Koranic schools (mahadras) by improving their live-conditions and boosting adapted protection measures
 - Direct assistance in the shape of food assistance (distribution of 3 meals per day) and non-food assistance (hygienic products and clothes)
 - Medical assistance and hygienic awareness, focusing on the inclusion of the migrant children in the national medical system
 - Implementation of recreational activities, both cultural and sportive
 - Literacy courses on French, Arabic and mathematics for the children in the mahadras that are not enrolled in formal education
 - Vocational and micro-business trainings for the children above 16 residing in the mahadras, with an approach based on selfreliance
 - Improvement of the toilettes and dormitories at the mahadras
 - Trainings on child protection for the religious leaders and Koranic teachers in charge of the mahadras
 - Assisted Voluntary Return and Reintegration (AVRR) for those vulnerable children wishing to return to their countries of origin

2. Prevent abuse or exploitation of migrants, with a focus on unaccompanied migrant children, promoting a human rights approach-based provision of adequate protection

Capacity building and technical support to the stakeholders of the protection system



- Specialized trainings to increase local stakeholders' capacity to protect and assist migrants, on counter-human trafficking and assisting victims of trafficking, communicating about migration, etc.
- Trainings on child protection, with a special focus on Best Interest Evaluation (BIA) and Determination process (BID)

<u>Awareness raising and reinforcement of the coordination and referral system</u>



- Publication of a practical guide for migrants in Mauritania, including information on available services (psychosocial, health, legal, accommodation, education, vocational trainings, AVRR)
- Publication of awareness material on the prevention and treatment of HIV in Mauritania

Main results achieved in phase 1 until May 2019

mahadras rehabilitated and provided with basic equipment

1,189 migrants and **Mauritanian students** received direct assistance (nutritional support, NFIs and clothing kits)
