Capacity building



- Support to the Moroccan Government in the fine tuning of the national asylum system
- Strengthening the capacities of the civil society and governmental organizations to offer protection services, with focus on the oriental border regions (Oujda, Nador, Tangier)
- Facilitation of the integration of refugees through: training of the national social assistance on international protection and on the specific needs for asylum-seekers and refugees
