Areas of Intervention

Referrals for registration and Refugee Status Determination (RSD)



- ◆ **Outreach and identification** of asylum-seekers in border areas
- ◆ **Referrals** from the oriental and northern region of Morocco (Oujda, Nador, Tangier) to UNHCR office in Rabat
- ◆ **Registration**
- ◆ **Joint RSD procedures** with national authorities

Capacity building



- ◆ **Support to the Moroccan Government** in the fine tuning of the national asylum system
- ◆ Strengthening the capacities of the civil society and governmental organizations to **offer protection services**, with focus on the oriental border regions (Oujda, Nador, Tangier)
- ◆ **Facilitation of the integration** of refugees through: training of the national social assistance on international protection and on the specific needs for asylum-seekers and refugees

Awareness raising



- ◆ **Informative campaigns** on the access to international protection in Morocco

- ◆ **Medical assistance**, including primary, secondary and tertiary healthcare

Main results achieved in phase 1-3 until December 2019

6,010 **individuals** identified and referred to the central office of UNHCR in Rabat for registration and RSD procedures

687 **national actors** trained on asylum referral, protection, RSD and border monitoring for better identification and referral of POCs

1,551 **Syrian and Non-Syrian individuals** referred for joint RSD procedures

269 **refugees** benefitted from national social services of Entraide Nationale

8,323 **medical consultations** were provided of which **3,205 were specialized medical assistance**

5,049 **Persons of Concern** received a complete set of information on the possibilities of accessing international protection in the border areas of the country

14 **workshops and trainings** delivered to national actors

Main results achieved in phase 4 until December 2020

1,484 **individuals** were referred to the UNHCR office in Rabat thanks to outreach/referral mechanism in 2020

1,096 **individuals** effectively submitted an asylum claim in 2020

139 **Syrian and Non-Syrian individuals** referred for joint RSD procedures

4-6 **weeks** as an average the registration waiting time has significantly increase from an average of 3 weeks during the first quarter of 2020 to six weeks in Q4

4 **days** Registration waiting time for vulnerable individuals and nationalities with highpresumption of eligibility for international protection

Child protection



- ◆ **enhance effective child protection and education systems** to address specific vulnerabilities and risks of children on the move
- ◆ **provide protection, assistance, and referral services** to children on the move at risk or victims of trafficking

- ◆ **develop an operational mechanism** for best interest assessment and determination for children on the move
- ◆ **development of transitional and assistance pilot centres** offering quality, inclusive and integrated services for children on the move are available
