Areas of Intervention

<u>Direct assistance to Nigerien nationals returning from Algeria on official convoys in</u>



- Assamaka: by the construction of two facilities and the distribution of food and water
- Arlit: by the distribution of food/water and non-food items for the most vulnerable (elderly, children, sick)
- Agadez: by the registration of the migrants in transit, the distribution of food and non-food items

Zinder:

by supporting the victims through the provision of food and nonfood items, medical care, psychological support, legal counselling
