Areas of Intervention

Direct assistance to Nigerien nationals returning from Algeria on official convoys in



- ◆ **Assamaka:** by the construction of two facilities and the distribution of food and water
- ◆ **Arlit:** by the distribution of food/water and non-food items for the most vulnerable (elderly, children, sick)
- ◆ **Agadez:** by the registration of the migrants in transit, the distribution of food and non-food items

Support to the National Agency for the Fight Against Trafficking in Persons and Migrant Smuggling (ANLTP/TIM) and victims of trafficking in the first shelter in Niger in



- ◆ **Zinder:** by supporting the victims through the provision of food and non-food items, medical care, psychological support, legal counselling

by supporting the ANLTP/TIM in the overall management and running of the shelter and case management

Capacity Building for the Nigerien Authorities



- ◆ **Specialized trainings for the authorities** in contact with the convoys to raise awareness about the vulnerable and the victims of trafficking returning from Algeria in order to better identify them and refer them to follow up care and protection

Main results achieved in phase 4 until January 2021

9,441 **returning Nigerien migrants** were assisted with transit shelter, food, water and NFI on the Assamaka, Arlit, Agadez axis

92 **victims of tracking** received direct assistance through shelter, food and NFIs in the shelter for victims of trafficking in Zinder

21 **official convoys** and 2 non-official convoys received

Areas of Intervention

Direct assistance



- ◆ **Improving reception conditions** and assistance for asylum-seekers and refugees in Niamey and Agadez
- ◆ **Meals, accommodation, medical and psychosocial assistance** for asylum-seekers and refugees hosted in the humanitarian centre of Agadez and the transit centres in Niamey
- ◆ **legal assistance** for asylum-seekers and refugees

Capacity building



- ◆ **improving access to international protection** through a direct collaboration with the National asylum system authorities (trainings, human resources equipment)

Awareness raising



- ◆ **creation of a toll-free information helpline** for refugees and asylum-seekers
- ◆ **dissemination of informative materials** on the procedures to access international protection

Main results achieved in phase 1 until December 2019

10 national refugees status determination experts selected and trained

2 polyfunctional centres of Agadez and Niamey renovated and expanded

1,300 individuals trained on international protection law and principles

1 national informative campaign activated

1,800 refugees and asylum seekers received basic assistance (food, housing, medical and psychosocial support)

90 initiatives, aimed at promoting pacific coexistence among refugees and hosting communities, carried out in Agadez

1 independent and free legal service activated in Niamey to assist asylum-seekers and refugees

Main results achieved in phase 3 and 4 until December 2020

100% targeted households whose basic needs are met with multi-purpose cash grants or vouchers

100% targeted population have access to primary health care

100% identified SGBV survivors received appropriate support

100% identified children of concern with specific needs have received child protection services, including Best Interest Assessments, Best Interest Determinations, access to educational opportunities.

1 working group led by UNHCR – DGECDM (General Directorate for Civil Status, Migration and Refugees) is established

1,221 individuals or 963 households received basic domestic items and food via cash grants or multi-purposes vouchers in 2020

3,632 medical consultations have been completed between the 2 health centres in the Humanitarian Centre and in Agadez in 2020

1,600 individuals received assistance in the reception facilities in Agadez

10 affiliated workforces trained, maintained or embedded within the Governmental structure or national NGO providing legal assistance

Areas of Intervention

Child protection



- ◆ **psychological support and training courses** for unaccompanied minors

Capacity building



- ◆ **strengthening of the protection system** for migrant minors
- ◆ **improvement of the existing national child protection systems** to respond more effectively to the needs of migrant and vulnerable children
- ◆ **training activities for police officers**, border officers and social workers on protection of children from exploitation and violence

Awareness raising



- ◆ **awareness raising and information** for young migrants and their families on the risks related to migration
